## ANTI BULLYING WEEK **Bullies Out**

Bryn Primary School will continue working with **Bullies Out** in Autumn Term 2, Bullies Out are an award winning charity working across the UK offering a range of practical, interactive activities and workshops with the aim to promote and foster safe, caring and respectful learning environments.

Workshops will initially run on **Monday 4<sup>th</sup> November** for pupils in Year 1 & 2 and Year 2 & 3. The workshops are entitled 'Positive Friendships' and 'Changing Attitudes' - pupils will explore qualities of positive friendships and develop awareness of the impact of bullying - socially, emotionally and physically.

Bryn Primary School will also celebrate **Anti Bullying Week** from **Monday 11<sup>th</sup> to Friday 15<sup>th</sup> November**, with the theme 'Choose Respect!' The theme aims to empower children not to resort to bullying, even when we disagree and reminds us to lead by example online and offline. Children will take part in a range of activities throughout the week designed to encourage them to think about how we can *Choose Respect* and how to role model this behaviour.

## AUTUMN CURRICULUM OFFER



The school adopts a conceptual approach to learning. The topics ensure full coverage of the curriculum and evidence activities relevant to the age group/progression step. Autumn Term's Theme is **Cynefin**.

Bryn Primary uses Bruner's spiral approach to curriculum design, so the concept is revisited in each year group but with a greater depth of learning. Evidence shows that when pupils re-engage with a topic repeatedly, they both consolidate prior knowledge in their memory and build on it over time.

To keep learning irresistible it is pupil-led and each class learns about Cynefin through a slightly different lens.

## PARKING AT DROP OFF AND PICK UP TIMES



Bryn Fields is close, safe, free parking that is allocated to school for your benefit during drop-off and pick-up times **and is only a short walk from the school gates**. Parents do not have access to park/drop off in the school carpark without permission.

### **Please be mindful not to:**

Block the road - emergency vehicles and other traffic may need access

Park on yellow lines, zig-zags or block the school entrance

***Park on the pavement, across dropped kerbs or residents' driveways***

***Park opposite or within 10 metres of a junction***

***Park where you will cause inconvenience to other road users***

Leave your vehicle with the engine still running

Stop in the middle of the road to drop your child off, even for a few seconds.
